This course focuses on the doctrines related to salvation, including the sufferings and death of Christ, the importance of the resurrection, redemption accomplished and applied, and the doctrines pertaining to reconciliation. This course also includes a unit on Christology, the person and work of Christ.

- You will know why Christ had to be both God and human to be our mediator.
- You will understand the Hypostatic Union, and how the two natures of Christ come together in One Person.

WHAT TO READ BEFORE CLASS BEGINS...

Before the start of the class, please finish your readings. Read for familiarity — mark up your books and highlight whatever jumps out at you.

READING 1: Erickson, part 7 (the Person of Christ) and part 10 (Salvation)) only.
READING 2: All of Giovannetti's book. (skim reading is okay)	

READING 3: All of Morris's book. (skim reading is okay)

OPTIONAL FINAL PAPER YOU WILL WRITE

You will write one final paper based on the course material.

Suggested due date: Paper is due 10 days after the last class session, but turn it in whenever you are able.

Compose a letter to a friend sharing the gospel. In this letter include 1-2 paragraph/
s on each of the following:
Describe the Savior, noting one aspect of his Person that qualifies him for
this role.
Explain one theological concept related to salvation, showing how it
connects to the deepest need of the human heart.
Anticipate and answer one objection to the gospel of grace.
Invite them to be saved, giving clear and concrete instructions.

Your final paper will be 1,000 to 1,500 words.

We will make it clear in our class how you can write an awesome Final Paper.

Please us only 12 point font, with no bold type.

Single space. Indent new paragraphs. No extra space between paragraphs.
